# Update

I have some further news to share with you all around staffing after the Easter Break.

Miss Brannan (TA in Ruby Class) will be leaving us to take up a new role at a school closer to where she lives. It will be sad to see her go but we obviously wish her well. Ruby Class will be supported by Mrs Benjafield. We will update parents as to Mrs B's intervention schedule after the holidays – some will be picked up by class staff and others will continue with Mrs B.

Ms Hancock (Teacher in Ruby Class) will be reducing her working days from four to three. Mrs Selway will be taking on the class teacher role on Thursday and Fridays.

Collective Worship will be moving to the end of the teaching day. This is to allow for phonics and reading to be taught at the same time across the school, thus ensuring that all children have access to the level of reading support they require. These lessons will begin at 9am so it is vital that all children are in school and ready to learn from 9am, the time from 8.45am to 9am is used for settling into the day and for basic skills activities.



This week we continued our build up towards Easter by looking at the story of the Widow's coins (an elderly widow showed sacrificial giving and a generous heart). The focus from this story was that Jesus encourages a spirit of generosity and compassion. We reflected on if there is someone we could be kind and helpful to this week and in our Friday assembly, Ruby's Olivia shared "I want to be helpful to all the teachers because they're amazing and they are always there for us, helping us with our problems" and Emerald's Patti said "I will help and be kind to my friends and family because they might need it".
