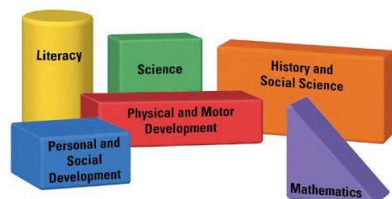
Out of School Achievements:

Our Curriculum



Zephaniah Class

In Zephaniah class, we have been learning about evolution and inheritance during our Science sessions. As a link to our English learning about Charles Darwin's exploration of the Galapagos Islands, we carried out an investigation to help us understand Darwin's theory about why finches on different islands had different variations. We used tweezers to represent the different shaped bird's beaks and rice and small balls to represent food types. We discovered that a bird's beak shape, directly linked to what it could eat. This helped us to understand how each island provided a different food type, which meant only birds with a certain beak type could survive on that island. Leading to them reproducing and passing on their characteristics - Darwin's theory of evolution.

HOW TO REGISTER FOR WISE UP WORKSHOPS

Step 1:

- Visit the Somerset Parent Carer Forum Website
- Go to our homepage and scroll down
- Near the bottom of the page, you'll find a tab labeled "Wise Up Workshops"
- Click "Read More"

Step 2: Choose Your Registration Path

There are two ways to register, depending on whether you're already on our database:

✓ If You Are Already Signed Up
(You receive newsletters or have attended events like previous workshops, the circus or pantomime)

- Simply tick "Register" for each workshop you'd like to attend.
- Scroll to the bottom of the page fill out your email address and click the blue "Register" button

✗ If You Are NOT Signed Up

- On the Wise Up page, halfway down, you'll see a paragraph titled "How to Register."
- Look for the sentence: "Individuals not on our database will need to register first by clicking here."
- Click the link and complete the sign-up form. Please note that when filling out the postcode part of the form it requires capital letters and a space in between postcode.
- Once you've signed up, return to the workshops page and follow the steps above to register for your chosen sessions.
