# Spotlight on Autism (ASC)

Autism is a lifelong neurodevelopmental difference. Children with autism may see, hear and process the world differently. In school, this can look like:

- Needing routine and predictability.
- Finding noise or crowds overwhelming.
- Communicating in unique ways.

Every autistic child is different, but many bring strengths in memory, honesty, attention to detail or specialist interests. By learning about autism, classmates develop patience and acceptance — skills that serve them well throughout life.


#### And finally...
