Head Lice

Recently, cases of head lice have been identified across the school and we wanted to make sure you were kept informed. Whilst lice are nothing more than a nuisance, it is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that any head lice can be dealt with quickly and before they are allowed to spread. As there has been an outbreak we request that parents thoroughly check their child's head as soon as possible, regularly treating as necessary so as to keep further outbreaks to a minimum. If your child has long hair, please ensure it is tied back to avoid further spread.

Thank you for your patience whilst booking for our Christmas Hot Lunch offering and meals for the last week of term was finalised. Parents can book on the Arbor parent portal but please be aware that the <u>deadline for ordering ALL MEALS for the last week of term is next Friday, 28th November. A reminder that there is no cost for those entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals or Free School Meals but, for those who pay, the charge is £3 per meal. There is no packed lunch option available that day, but jacket potatoes will be available to order.</u>

Ad Hoc MDSA vacancy

We are looking to recruit an ad hoc Lunchtime Supervisory Assistant to ensure we can cover when other supervisors aren't available. Experience of working with children in a voluntary or paid capacity is preferred. We have a really friendly and dedicated lunchtime team and full training will be given. Equity in Action

You may notice some children using extra resources or having different classroom routines. For example:

- A child using a wobble cushion to help concentration.
- A child having movement breaks.
- A child using visual timetables.
- A child using a fidget item or transitional object

These are called "reasonable adjustments". They don't give unfair advantage — they give fair access to learning. When we make learning fair for everyone, all children benefit from a more supportive and flexible classroom.
