Each week, in this new section of our newsletter, we will focus on a different topic – from what inclusion really means to exploring common needs such as ADHD, autism and dyslexia. Our aim is to give you clear, simple information, share the strategies we use in school and celebrate the strengths which every child brings.

Spotlight on Dyslexia

Dyslexia affects how the brain processes words and symbols. It mainly impacts reading, spelling, and writing but has nothing to do with intelligence. Children with dyslexia might:

- Mix up letters or struggle to sound out words.
- Find writing tasks tiring.
- Need more time to read.

But dyslexia is also linked with strong problem-solving skills, creativity and "big picture" thinking. In school, we use tools like coloured overlays, technology and alternative ways to record work. These small adjustments can make a big difference.




