Anning Class

In Geography, Anning class have been learning all about natural disasters. For the past two weeks the children have been focusing on Volcanoes. They have learnt how they are formed, the different types and the features of a volcano. Last lesson they had to compare reasons for and against as to whether or not they would like to live near a volcano. After a class vote, most of the children decided the risk was too great and that they wouldn't want to live anywhere near a volcano!





Online Safety

As many of our children use WhatsApp and other online platforms to stay connected, it is important to ensure they understand how to navigate these spaces safely, especially in large groups. Below are some tips and guidelines to help you support your child's online safety:

Key Safety Tips for WhatsApp Use

- 1. Be Cautious About Group Membership
 - Monitor the groups your child is added to and ensure they only participate in groups with people they know and trust.
 - $\circ~$ Remind them they can leave groups where they feel uncomfortable.
- 2. Privacy Settings Matter
 - Ensure their profile photo, status, and other information are only visible to "Contacts" (not "Everyone"). You can adjust these in WhatsApp's Privacy Settings.
- 3. Talk About Sharing Responsibly
 - Discuss what's appropriate to share, including avoiding personal details, locations, or photos of themselves or others without consent.
 - Remind them to think before forwarding messages to avoid spreading misinformation.
- 4. Recognising and Avoiding Risks
 - \circ $\,$ Teach them to ignore messages from unknown numbers and report suspicious behavior.
 - Encourage them to speak to you, or a trusted adult at school, if they encounter anything inappropriate or concerning.
- 5. Managing Negative Interactions
 - In large groups, conflicts or unkind comments can escalate quickly. Encourage your child to stay respectful and avoid engaging in arguments.
 - They can mute or leave groups if they feel overwhelmed or unsafe.
 - o Ask them to speak to you if any comments or conflicts have upset them.

- 6. Set Screen Time Limits
 - o Balance WhatsApp use with offline activities. Setting boundaries can help prevent excessive screen time.

Between school and home, we can help create a safe online environment for our children by staying informed and having open conversations with them about their online experiences. Please do contact us if you have any questions, or concerns.

Year 5 and 6 Bikeability Course – 10th & 11h February – 2 SPACES LEFT!

We have arranged a cycle training course, in conjunction with Somerset Road Safety, to take place in school over two days on 10th and 11th February. The Bikeability course has been designed to give the next generation the skills and confidence to ride their bikes on today's roads. To enable this course to run, we need adult helpers with a roadworthy bike and bike helmet to accompany the children across the 2 days – it doesn't have to be the same person every day so if you can volunteer your time, even if it is just for one of the days, please do contact the school office. If you would like your Year 5 or Year 6 child to attend the course please do let the school office know: places will be allocated with Year 6 children taking priority and only those who have not done the course before may apply. Children will need a roadworthy bicycle, a bike helmet and be confident enough to ride on the roads around Templecombe.
