

# Newsletter (9) Friday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2021

It could hardly have escaped anyone's notice that this week has been a very challenging week for our whole school community. Covid has rapidly spread through our youngest class, children and staff, and is now affecting our other classes too. You know that I take our responsibility to protect your families and our staff very seriously and I have been in constant contact with Public Health England since last Sunday to ensure that all possible protective measures are being followed; at times I have had to bow to their public health knowledge over what is best and they strongly believe that through our measures in school, backed up by staff and children taking part in regular testing (LFD and PCR), we can prevent an even wider outbreak.

One change we are making to our published guidance, in consultation with PHE, is that where a child tests positive for Covid, their siblings are requested not to attend school for the duration of the isolation period, even after receiving a negative PCR result. Over this week we have seen that siblings are testing positive 2-3 days after the original positive PCR result.

Thank you for your support and bearing with us, it does mean a lot during these challenging times.



### **Collective Worship**

We have continued our theme of Mr Men Faith. This week we considered Mr Busy and whether we stop, reflect and give time to important things such as those that have suffered in the past for our freedoms today. On Thursday we took part in the national Act of Remembrance at Templecombe Memorial – the children were brilliant in how they respected the time. During our reflection assemblies today, Emerald Class shared "We thought about how we could reflect on Remembrance Day and Emily had the idea of making hearts to wear. On the hearts, we wrote the names of soldiers who died over 100 years ago who lived around Templecombe and Wincanton. It felt like we were holding a real and special person in our heart, even though they died a long time ago" and Topaz's Nathan said "I thank the soldiers who fought and lost their lives in wars to keep us safe".
