Illness quidance

My child feels unwell with one or more of these symptoms:	Do not come to school Inform the school by 9am

	 Cough High / low temperature Shivering Loss of taste or smell Exhaustion Aching body Headache Sore throat Loss of appetite Feeling / Being sick Diarrhoea 	 Stay at home – work will not be provided as your child is ill If your child has been sick or has diarrhoea, they should not attend school until 48 hours have passed since the last bout of illness Return to school when your child feels well enough If your child has mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat or mild cough, and they feel well enough, they can go to school. If we are concerned, school staff will contact you to discuss their illness.
2	My child is unwell with symptoms not associated with COVID-19 eg. Spots / Rash / Swollen glands	 Inform the school by 9am If your child has been sick or has diarrhoea, they should not attend school until 48 hours have passed since the last bout of illness Return to school when your child feels well enough – work will not be provided as your child is ill
3	My child has tested positive for COVID-19.	 Do not come to school Inform the school of the test result Self-isolate for 3 days minimum – work will be provided (if your child is well enough to attempt school work) If they feel unwell, your child should only return to school once they are completely well
4	Someone in the household tests positive for COVID-19.	Child can continue to attend school If they start to feel unwell then follow step 1 or 2 depending on symptoms


