### **Cool Milk**

The <u>School Food Standards legislation</u> states that lower fat milk must be available for <u>all pupils</u> during the school day. Luckily with Cool Milk, it couldn't be easier to arrange this if you haven't already done so. Simply <u>click here</u> to access the direct link to parents <u>Parent-Registration-Letter.pdf</u>. Under the standards, children eligible for benefits-based free school meals should be offered milk free of charge, so please email the office to sign your child up to receive milk if your child is entitled to free school meals.

### And finally...


